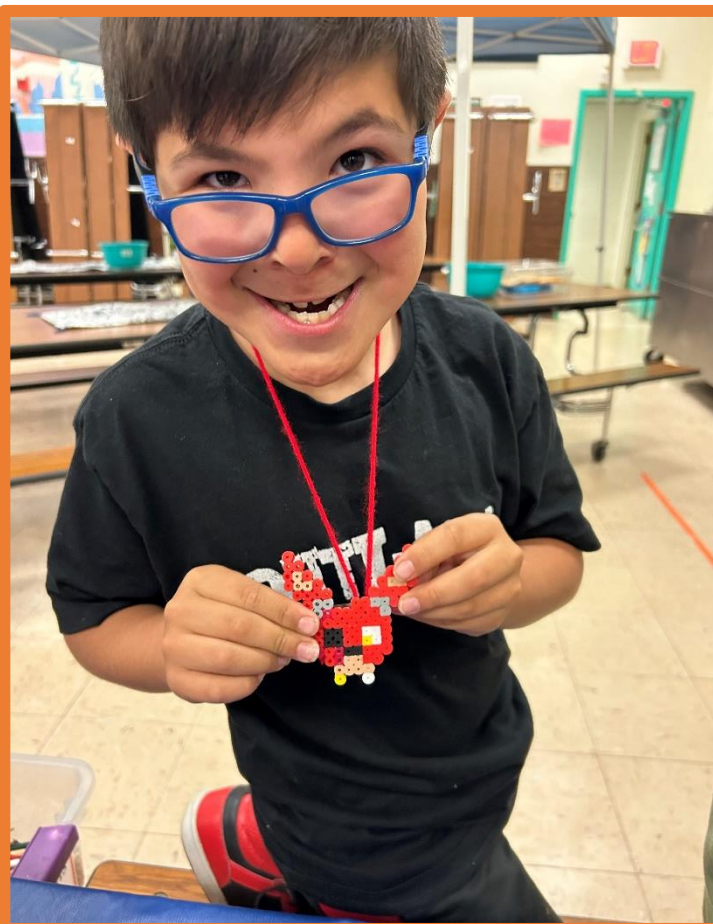
Melty Bead Keychains with Maggie

Culture Club has arrived at its final destination, Japan!

Because food is the best way to start things off, we began exploring the great cuisine of Japan and we learned how to make sushi! I decided to keep it simple with the ingredients to also highlight the ease and affordability of making sushi at home. We made a variation of a California Roll and a Vegetable Roll, using imitation crab, avocado, cucumber, and carrots. We had minimal prep for the veggies, to which the kids gladly took over. I premade the rice so once the veggies were cut we were ready to assemble the rolls. Jarell volunteered to be the first example roll so we laid out a piece of nori on our rolling mat, spread the rice, and loaded the sheet with all the veggies and crab, carefully rolled it up, and finally, sliced it into about 6 pieces. After I demonstrated how to do it, I allocated rice for each participant and they began to make their rolls. Everyone was super excited to make their own specialty rolls and enjoy them with the soy sauce, wasabi, and ginger. Overall the kids really enjoyed making their own sushi and thought it was super delicious and easy to make!

Overall, while a little challenging mostly everyone was able to make 2-3 different origami designs with help from everyone in the group. It ended up being really enjoyable and the kids enjoyed their creations!
