Tinfoil Spiders w/Ethan D. (10)

This activity showed how trusting your creativity can break down expectations and allow the kids to make memories with friends, create art they are proud of and the golden rule of Children's Choice, having fun! It was awesome to see how into the activity the kids got, even using the boxes and empty rolls of aluminum foil. It was a great lesson that going with the flow allows the kids to have more fun and engage more into the activity with making it their own.

Flapping Butterflies

We used two different sized straws and tape to make the wings move. It was definitely more fun allowing the kids to have their own artistic design to their butterflies. It was great watching all the kids complement each other and their work and even at times give inspiration to others.














Puzzle Mania w/Everest (9)
