

PUFFY SIDEWALK CHALK



Once again, the insightful Hubert Humphrey Caregivers have put together an activity that perfectly blends our love for the outdoors with our love for crafts! Our amazing caregiver Taytumn, helped us make puffy sidewalk chalk which we used to enjoy some outdoor art!

HOW YOU MAKE PUFFY SIDEWALK CHALK:

- 1. Gather ingredients: dish soap, water, flour, side walk chalk, and condiment squeeze bottle
- 2. Mix one cup flour, 1 cup water, 1 tbsp dish soap, and one crushed piece of side walk chalk.
- 3. Pour mixture into condiment squeeze bottle (we used a funnel for easy clean up)
- 4. Once you have mixed all of your desired colors, use your condiment squeeze bottles to decorate your sidewalks!
- 5. Clean up: this puffy paint has the same easy cleanup as standard sidewalk chalk, but if you're wanting a fresh palette or simply to clean up the yard, a garden hose should do the trick
