



















Older Kids Club Solar Oven w/Zach M. (9)

Zach M. has an interest in solar power this school year, particularly with magnification and burning things. So, we decided together to channel this interest better into something really cool- a heavy duty solar oven! We gathered lots of wood, nails, tools, and a fancy Fresnel lens. On day 1, we started out by discussing the solar ovens we've made in the past (usually out of pizza boxes), looked at our materials, and started designing what we wanted our oven to look like. Meleena (9) had the idea of a 6-sided oven with a lid that opens and closes with a hinge, which we all agreed we liked! Then, Sadie (10) came up with a design with tilted walls for better concentration of solar energy, and a door on the side to slide a pan or plate in and out. We decided in the end on a combination of these two, and so we got to work.

After going over woodshop safety, we started by measuring our wood and beginning to cut. We all got to wear this big over the top full-face mask, which everyone thought was pretty funny. After cutting a couple pieces, our resident photographer, **Charlotte T (9)**, directed us to take some pictures with our tools. The favorites were all the clamps, which the kids continued to reference for the rest of the club. By the end of day 1, our wood was cut and all that was left to do was sand it, cut a hole in our roof, and nail it all together.











One week later, we started on the rest of our work for day 2. We went over the tools we had, looked at our newly glued in lens, and got ready to work with hammers. Quickly, we learned that this wood did not want to cooperate with us- it took a long time and a lot of force to get the nails through one piece of wood, let alone two. And, after finally getting the nail through both pieces... the wood split! After some problem solving, **Abrianna (10)** suggested we just move the nail a couple of inches over and try again, which worked wonders.

By the end of this day, we were only able to get 4 nails into our project, even with everyone taking turns to hammer. So, we decided to put the project on pause and try again another time. If we aren't able to finish on day 3, the kids want to try again from scratch with all our new knowledge. But for now, we have a lovely bookshelf shaped item, and we all had fun eating our un-sundried fruit.



Sewing Club

In Sewing Club, we were excited to make stuffed things like little plushies and pillows. We really enjoyed cutting out the fabric of our creations. Some kids made "Among Us" characters for their siblings. Others made little pillows for their dolls at home. Sewing taught us to take our time to sew since if you rush it the big stitches won't hold the stuffing. So, we also learned to do small stitches!
